3. Request for Approval of Proposed Amendments of MDEQ Surface Water and Groundwater Use and Protection Regulations

The proposed amendments include removal of the ten-dollar (\$10.00) permit application fee and removal of the requirement to send permit reissuance notifications by certified mail in accordance with statutory changes mandated by Senate Bill 2415, which passed during the Regular Session of 2026 and was approved by the Governor. No comments on the proposed changes were received during the public notice period or at the public hearing. The Office of Land and Water Resources Permitting, Certification and Compliance Division is requesting the Commission's approval to finalize MDEQ's draft surface water and groundwater use permitting regulations for adoption.

4. Commission Approval of Brownfield Agreement Termination

The Commission approved Brownfield Agreement #7469-25 in March 2025 between the Commission and Tracetown Redevelopment, LLC for the remediation of a multiunit commercial property located at 55 Sergeant Prentiss Drive, Natchez, Mississippi. The original brownfield agreement required the remediation of asbestos containing materials (ACM) that were determined to be in excess of the Environmental Protection Agency's 1% ACM threshold in building and construction materials. The completed remedial activities have met the requirements of the MDEQ-approved Corrective Action Plan dated January 14, 2025. Tracetown Redevelopment, LLC has requested the Commission to make a determination as to the completion of the Brownfield Agreement. The staff of the MDEQ has evaluated the Brownfield Agreement completion and believes that the Site is in compliance with applicable State and Federal laws and standards and will be protective of the public health and the environment. The staff recommends the completion of the Brownfield Agreement.

5. Request for Commission Approval of Qualified Environmental Response Action Contractors as Duly Authorized Representatives

The Groundwater Assessment and Remediation Division ("GARD") requests that the Commission approve Qualified Environmental Response Action Contractors ("ERACs") as "duly authorized representatives" of the Commission when performing work for the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality ("MDEQ") under their respective ERAC contracts. The approved list of ERACs was established in accordance with 11 Miss. Admin. Code Pt. 5, Ch. 1, following MDEQ's issuance of a Request for Qualifications ("RFQ"). Mississippi Code Annotated § 49-17-21 authorizes the Commission, or its "duly authorized representative", to enter at reasonable times upon private or public property for the purpose of inspecting and investigating conditions relating to pollution or possible pollution of any air or waters of the State. Accordingly, staff requests that the Commission recognize and approve the following ERACs as "duly authorized representatives" of the Commission whenever they are performing work for MDEQ under their respective ERAC contracts:

This authorization will permit the listed ERACs to assist MDEQ staff with site inspections, investigations, sampling, and other activities authorized by Mississippi Code Annotated § 49-17-21 et seq. The authorization applies only while an ERAC is performing work for MDEQ under its ERAC contract and remains in effect for the duration of that contract. The contracts commenced on July 1, 2025, and continue through June 30, 2029. Each contract may be extended for one additional year before expiration upon the written agreement of both parties and under the same prices, terms, and conditions as the original contract. The total contract term, including any extension, may not exceed five years.
