MDEQ BUSINESS FOR REPORTING PURPOSES ONLY

1. Environmental Covenant for Monomoy BTS Corporation

Pursuant to the Commission's delegation regulations (11 Miss. Admin. Code Pt. 1, R.1.1.Y.), the Executive Director of MDEQ approved the Environmental Covenants between the Commission and Monomoy BTS Corporation regarding the remediation of property located 2611 South Liberty Street in Canton, Madison County, MS. Monomoy BTS Corporation purchased the site which was formerly used for agricultural purposes including mixing pesticides. Environmental Site Assessments have revealed a release of pesticides impacting soils at concentrations in excess of Target Remediation Goals (TRGs). Therefore, remediation of the site is necessary. Staff of MDEQ has evaluated the proposed Environmental Covenant and believes that, with the conditions and restrictions contained within; the site will be in compliance with applicable State laws and standards and will be protective of the public health and the environment.
