#### 3. Commission Approval of Brownfield Agreement

The staff recommends that the Commission approve the Brownfield Agreement between the Commission and Jack's Family Restaurant, LP regarding the remediation of brownfield property located at 112 Cagle Street in Louisville, Mississippi. The administrative record for this environmental response project is referred to as the Team Motors site. The proposed Brownfield Agreement Site previously operated as an automotive body shop, petroleum distribution facility, and most recently as commercial retail property. Site assessments have identified asbestos containing materials, solid wastes, and chlorinated solvents and petroleum hydrocarbons in the subsurface. Therefore, remediation of the proposed Brownfield Agreement Site is necessary. The proposed use of the Site after completion of all remediation will be commercial as a Jack's Family Restaurant. The staff of the MDEQ has evaluated the Brownfield Agreement and believes that, with the conditions and restrictions contained within the Brownfield Agreement, the Site will be in compliance with applicable State and Federal laws and standards and will be protective of the public health and the environment.

### 4. Environmental Covenant for Transmontaigne Operating Company, LP

Pursuant to the Commission's delegation regulations (11 Miss. Admin. Code Pt. 1, R.1.1.Y.), the Executive Director of MDEQ approved the Restrictive Use Agreed Order and Environmental Covenants between the Commission and TransMontaigne Operating Company, LP regarding the remediation of property located at 310 Walthall Street, Greenville, Washington County, Mississippi. TransMontaigne Operating Company, LP operated the site as the TransMontaigne Operating Company, LP Walthall Street Terminal, a bulk petroleum distribution facility. Environmental Site Assessments have revealed a release of petroleum impacting soils and groundwater at concentrations in excess of Target Remediation Goals (TRGs). Therefore, remediation of the site is necessary. The staff of the MDEQ has evaluated the proposed Restrictive Use Agreed Order and Environmental Covenant and believes that, with the conditions and restrictions contained within; the site will be in compliance with applicable State laws and standards and will be protective of the public health and the environment. This agenda item is for reporting purposes only.

## 5. Commission Approval of Brownfield Agreement Termination

The Commission approved Brownfield Agreement 6761-17 in June 2017 between the Commission and WALM Properties, LLP for the remediation of the former Big Yank property located in West Point, Mississippi. The original brownfield agreement required the remediation of various chlorinated solvents and other Volatile Organic Compounds in the soil and groundwater. The completed remedial activities have met the requirements of the MDEQ-approved Corrective Action Plan dated March 2017. WALM Properties, LLP has requested the Commission to make a determination as to the completion of the Brownfield Agreement. The staff recommends the completion of the Brownfield Agreement. The staff of the MDEQ has evaluated the Brownfield Agreement completion and believes that the Site is in compliance with applicable State and Federal laws and standards and will be protective of the public health and the environment.
