This state statute provides that any commission member who does not attend three consecutive regular meetings of the commission is subject to removal by a majority vote of the commission members. The Commission will consider whether to remove Commissioner Flowers from the Commission pursuant to the statute because he has not attended the last three consecutive commission meetings.

5. Serenity Lane-Pearl River County-Proposed Final Order

Following a presentation by designated Hearing Officer Frank Spencer at its meeting on May 25, 2017, the Commission adopted his Findings and Recommendations related to the Serenity Lane evidentiary hearing previously held on October 17 and 18, 2016, and determined in part there was no need for further assessment or remediation activities at the site. A proposed final Order has been provided to the Commission members, which memorializes the Commission's decision in this matter. Staff recommends the Commission adopt the final Order.

6. Pearl River Basin Development District-Appointment to the Board of Directors

Pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. § 51-11-5, the Commission is required to appoint a member of the Board of Directors of the Pearl River Basin Development District ("PRBDD"). Keith Harkins, who has retired from MDEQ, previously was appointed by the Commission. Staff recommends that Alice Perry be appointed by the Commission to replace Keith and serve on the Board of Directors of PRBDD during the last months of the existence of the PRBDD, which will be legislatively dissolved effective June 30, 2018.

7. Commission Approval of Proposed Amendments to 11 Miss. Admin. Code Pt. 6, Ch. 3, entitled Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality Regulations for the Certification of Municipal and Domestic Wastewater Facility Operators

The proposed amendments revise the Professional reference section to require that references be obtained from certified operators at the same classification or higher than the classification being requested; amends experience requirements to require that one year of experience be under the supervision of a certified operator; adds requirement that a certified operator's principal residence be no more than 50 miles from any system being operated by that certified operator; requires that operators attend an approved wastewater operator short course for the appropriate classification within 12 months prior to testing for that classification; allows for reciprocity to be granted to any state that has entered into a reciprocity agreement with the Department; and corrects errors and omissions. A public hearing on the amendments was held on May 25, 2017. Staff will recommend adoption of the proposed amendments.

8. Water Pollution Control Revolving Loan Fund (WPCRLF) Program Adoption of FY-2017 Intended Use Plan

The staff will recommend adoption by the Commission of the FY-2017 Intended Use Plan. This document identifies the loan funds available to our communities for the construction of wastewater infrastructure, the communities to receive these loan funds, the loan interest rate, program deadlines, and other related information. Public comments on the draft Intended Use Plan have been solicited through a public comment period and a public hearing.

9. Commission Approval of Brownfield Agreement

The staff recommends that the Commission approve the Brownfield Agreement between the Commission and MMC Materials, Inc. regarding the remediation of brownfield property located at 2251 Manufacturer's Blvd in Brookhaven, Mississippi. The administrative record for this environmental response project is referred to as the MMC Materials Brownfield Agreement Site. The subject property is located adjacent to the former Escambia Wood Treating facility. Assessments conducted on the subject property have demonstrated that shallow soils at the site have been impacted by deposition of dust from the adjacent former wood treating operation resulting in soil concentrations at levels exceeding the Brownfield Target Remediation Goals. Therefore, remediation of the MMC Materials Brownfield Agreement Site is necessary. The proposed use of the Site after completion of all remediation will be a MMC Materials concrete operation. The staff of the MCEQ has evaluated the Brownfield Agreement and believes that, with the conditions and restrictions contained within the Brownfield Agreement, the Site will be in compliance with applicable State and Federal laws and standards and will be protective of the public health and the environment.

10. Commission Approval of Environmental Covenant

The staff recommends that the Commission approve the Environmental Covenants between the Commission and Norfolk Southern Corporation regarding the remediation of property located at 3701 3rd Street South, Meridian, MS. Norfolk Southern Corporation operated the site as the Norfolk Southern Railyard. Environmental Site Assessments have revealed a release of petroleum impacting soils and groundwater at concentrations in excess of Target Remediation Goals (TRGs). Therefore, remediation of the site is necessary. The staff of the MCEQ has evaluated the proposed Environmental Covenant and believes that, with the conditions and restrictions contained within; the site will be in compliance with applicable State laws and standards and will be protective of the public health and the environment.

11. Asbestos Certifications

We have issued 417 asbestos certifications since the last report. This list will be available at the Commission meeting.

12. Lead Paint Certifications

We have issued 147 lead paint certifications since the last report. This list will be available at the Commission meeting.

13. Underground Storage Tanks (UST) Certifications

We have issued 21 certifications to those who install, alter, or remove underground storage tanks since the last report. This list will be available at the Commission meeting.

14. Wastewater Operator Certifications

We have issued 53 wastewater operator certifications since the last report. This list will be available at the Commission meeting.
