4. Adoption of a Revision to the State Implementation Plan and amendments to 11 Mississippi Administrative Code, Part 2, Chapter 11, "Regulations for Ambient Air Quality Nonattainment Areas"

A public hearing was held on July 2, 2015 concerning a proposed Revision to the State Implementation Plan for the Control of Air Pollution (SIP Revision) and proposed amendments to Commission Regulations 11 Mississippi Administrative Code, Part 2, Chapter 11, "Regulations for Ambient Air Quality Non-Attainment Areas". The proposed SIP Revision and proposed regulation amendments concern the correction of a source applicability error in the regulations and the addition of clarifying language. No comments were received. A transcript of the public hearing proceeding has been provided. We are recommending that the Commission adopt the SIP Revision and the regulation amendments.

5. Water Pollution Control Revolving Loan Fund (WPCRLF) Program, Conditional Adoption of FY-2015 Intended Use Plan

Due to the necessity for action on the FY-2015 Intended Use Plan prior to September 30, 2015, staff will recommend adoption by the Commission of the FY-2015 WPCRLF Intended Use Plan, subject to completion of the required public notice period and public hearing, and provided that any resulting public comments are resolved without significant changes. The staff recommendation includes Commission delegation of authority to the Executive Director to execute an order approving the Intended Use Plan if there are no significant changes or comments resulting from public participation. The Plan is currently at public notice and a public hearing is scheduled for Tuesday, September 22, 2015. The Intended Use Plan identifies the loan funds available to our communities for the construction of wastewater infrastructure, the communities to receive these loan funds, the loan interest rate, program deadlines, and other related information. This Plan also reflects the implementation of the new federal requirements which apply to FY-2015 and after loan projects.

6. Commission Approval of Brownfield Obligation Transfer

On April 28, 2011, the Commission reached a Brownfield Agreement (#5958-11) with the City of Picayune and Stockstill Brothers Investments, LLC for the remediation of the Arizona Chemical Facility in Picayune, Mississippi. In accordance with Rule 2.1.5.C of Part 3, Chapter 2: Final Regulations Governing Brownfield Voluntary Cleanup and Redevelopment in Mississippi, the City of Picayune, Stockstill Brothers Investments, LLC and Huey P. Stockstill, LLC jointly have provided a petition to the MCEQ that Huey P. Stockstill, LLC has the financial, managerial, and technical resources to complete performance of the Brownfield Agreement obligations and agrees to complete this performance. The staff of the MDEQ has reviewed the petition, and hereby recommends that the Commission issue an order in accordance with the Brownfield Regulations approving the transfer of those obligations in Brownfield Agreement #5958-11 from Stockstill Brothers Investments, LLC to Huey P. Stockstill, LLC. Huey P. Stockstill, LLC plans to continue to use the facility for concrete and asphalt operations.

7. Commission Approval of Environmental Covenant

The staff recommends that the Commission approve the Environmental Covenant between the Commission, Gayle and Tommy M. Davis, and the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") regarding the remediation of property located on Jackson Road in Hattiesburg, Lamar County, Mississippi, referred to as the "Davis Timber Company Superfund Site." The facility has historically been utilized as a wood treatment operation. Hazardous wastes, hazardous constituents, hazardous substances, pollutants, or contaminants remain on the Property. The property is the subject of a remedial action pursuant to the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980, 42 U.S.C. §§ 9601 et seq. ("CERCLA"), more particularly described in the EPA's Record of Decision ("ROD") issued on September 24, 2009. EPA selected a remedial action for the property in the ROD that involved capping of contamination in place. Therefore, remediation of the site is necessary. The restrictions presented in the proposed environmental covenant will allow for the site to be used as a community-based animal shelter. The staff of the MCEQ has evaluated the proposed Environmental Covenant and believes that, with the conditions and restrictions contained within, the site will be in compliance with applicable State and Federal laws and standards and will be protective of the public health and the environment.

8. MDEQ 2017-2021 Strategic Plan

On August 17, 2015, MDEQ submitted it Strategic Plan for Fiscal Years 2017-2021 to the Legislative Budget Office. The Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994 mandates the development of 5-year strategic plans for all state agencies. The plan provides a clear and concise blueprint for how the agency will protect human health and the environment over the next several years and how we plan to measure our performance. A copy of the Strategic Plan will be provided to each Commissioner.
